These winners will take home the spelling bee book on Thursday, January 8 with the Green Meadows Spelling Bee taking place on Friday, January 16 in our gym. There will be no alternates for the school spelling bee. If your child is absent on January 16, he/she will not be able to compete in the spelling bee. Likewise, there will be no alternate for the regional spelling bee.
